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Apply Today - APIASF Community College Scholarship Now Available Online

The Asian & Pacific Islander American Scholarship Fund (APIASF) is now accepting applications for the **APIASF Community College Scholarship Program**. The organization's new scholarship opportunity - ranging from \$2,250 to \$5,000 each during the 2012-13 academic school year - is available to 155 full-time, degree-seeking Asian American and Pacific Islander (AAPI) students who are enrolled the following institutions:

- **City College of San Francisco,**
- **Coastline Community College,**
- **De Anza College, or**
- **South Seattle Community College.**

APIASF Community College Scholarship Program applicants must be of AAPI ethnicity as defined by the [U.S. Department of Census](#) and must be a citizen, national, or legal permanent resident of the United States or a citizen of the U.S. Freely Associated States. Other eligibility requirements include completion of the Free Application for Federal Student Aid (FAFSA), although applicants do not need to be recipients of federal financial aid to be eligible for the APIASF Community College Scholarship Program. **The application deadline is Friday, October 12, 2012 at 6 p.m. Pacific Daylight Time (PDT).**

Additionally, the APIASF Community College Scholarship Program supports the new **Partnership for Equity in Education through Research (PEER) project**, which APIASF, along with the National Commission on Asian American and Pacific Islander Research in Education (CARE), launched recently to help realize the full degree-earning potential of the AAPI student population. Considered one of the largest investments to date to increase AAPI student success, the PEER project is a three-year, nearly \$2 million effort being supported by The Kresge Foundation, USA Funds, and the Walmart Foundation. The PEER project also works collaboratively with three of the APIASF Community College Scholarship Program institutions: De Anza College, City College of San Francisco, and South Seattle Community College.

Emerging AAPI Communities Shape APIASF's 2012 Outreach Schedule

As one of the fastest growing populations in the United States, the Asian American and Pacific Islander community is experiencing significant increases in ethnic groups that have created several new emerging communities. A recent data summary prepared by the National Commission on Asian American and Pacific Islander Research in Education (CARE) for the 2012 APIASF Higher Education Summit revealed that in the last decade, there were approximately 250,000 refugees from Burma, Nepal and Bhutan, many of whom were not counted in the 2010 Census.

To further the goal of increasing access to higher education for underserved populations and making a difference in communities, these emerging groups have become critical points to raise awareness of APIASF's scholarship programs and services. APIASF has developed an extensive outreach plan to meet these students where they live and will be conducting outreach in six new cities during the 2012 - 2013 application cycle. These cities include:

- Salt Lake City, Utah;
- Portland, Oregon;
- Omaha, Nebraska;
- Springdale, Arkansas;
- New Orleans, Louisiana; and
- Columbia, South Carolina.
