Department of Education Announces Request For Information on Disaggregated Data for AAPIs

With the vast diversity that exists within the Asian American and Pacific Islander (AAPI) community, the disaggregation of data is critical to ensuring an accurate depiction of the needs and experiences of AAPIs. Disaggregated data is especially important when it comes to education and dispelling many of the misperceptions that exist about AAPI students. Without this information, agencies and institutions are often unable to identify and address the unique needs of the students who are not succeeding.

On May 4, the Department of Education issued a Request for Information (RFI) to gather and share information about practices and policies regarding existing education data systems that disaggregate data on the AAPI community. The information collected will be used by educational agencies, schools and institutions of higher education to share best practices and overcome challenges to gathering disaggregated data on AAPI students.

This RFI is a fundamental step to advance AAPI college completion and better support student success. Community members, educators, students and organizations are encouraged
