Proposals were asked to focus on two key areas:

- Mobilizing resources and advancing institutional capacity to increase higher education access for AAPIs
- Policy, program, or practice facilitating student access and success in higher education for AAPIs

Attending University of California, kicked off a national public awareness effort dedicated to increasing access and completion among AAPI students, the fastest-growing, but often the most overlooked and underserved student population at U.S. colleges and universities.

The new student-centered and -led campaign, "We're the Changing Face of America," is a multi-layered, grassroots effort working through strategic partnerships with three of the nation's Asian American and Native American Pacific Islander-Serving Institutions (AANAPISIs): De Anza College, City College of San Francisco, and South Seattle Community College. In



addition to the campaign's AANAPISI partners, other supporters at business, civil rights, community-based, and student- and youth-advocacy organizations are playing an important role in sharing information and messages. For a complete list of partners, click here.

The campaign supports the Partnership for Equity in Education through Research (PEER) project that APIASF and CARE launched in June 2012 to help improve educational outcomes for the AAPI student population.
