APIASF Announces New Community College Scholarships Recipients

With nearly 50 percent of all AAPI students enrolled in higher education attending community colleges, APIASF's Community College Scholarship Program provides some of the nation's most underserved students with better opportunities to access and succeed in college.

APIASF announced the selection of its 2012 - 2013 recipients yesterday. The new scholarships will provide 135 full-time, degree-seeking AAPI students with \$2,500 scholarships to support their school year at City College of San Francisco, De Anza College or South Seattle Community College. Many of these scholars will have the opportunity to receive another \$2,500 for the 2013 - 2014 academic year. In addition to these awards, APIASF recently announced five new Scholars who will each receive \$5,000 scholarships at Coastline Community College.

Each application takes approximately 10-15 minutes to review.

All readers must have an undergraduate college diploma and/or 7-10 years of work experience.
